

### Annual Memorial Mass



### What Are The Effects of Anointing?

Anointing strengthens the soul of the sick person by awakening confidence in God's mercy. It also gives the strength to bear suffering and resist temptation. Someone who offers their suffering to God in union with Christ can aid their own salvation and assist that of others, "*in my flesh I complete what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church*" (Col 1:24). When the Eucharist accompanies Anointing it is called *viaticum*, "food for the journey."

Anointing remits sins. It takes away venial sins and when the person is incapable of confessing it can take away mortal sins as well. The sacrament of Confession often accompanies Anointing.

God intends Anointing to help us achieve salvation. The sacrament does, therefore, heal our bodies when this is to our spiritual advantage. It is not God's will, however, that we ultimately avoid natural death, which is now our means of entry to eternal life. *Taken from Evangelium*

### Marriage

Jesus made marriage a sacrament. The Church knows that this means that he [ Jesus ] himself will provide the strength to keep the commitment. The hardness of our hearts (*left unhealed*) makes marriage extremely difficult, and perhaps even impossible, but grace softens hearts and works the necessary miracle. A graced marriage opens hearts to a love and joy and peace of which we are not capable on our own. The unmarried can know a divine love and peace and joy, but the miracle of marriage




is that it enables a love neither *merely* divine nor *merely* human. ### Convalidation

Church law requires baptized Roman Catholics to marry before a bishop, priest, or deacon and two witnesses. Catholics who have married outside of the Catholic Church are encouraged to have their civil marriage recognized by the Church. This is called **convalidation**. The process does not cost anything, is often not very difficult and always helps the couple live their faith more fully. Please contact the parish office for more information or to arrange an appointment to begin the process of convalidating your civil union.
