

Lenten Study Series -In Four Sessions

This year the Lenten study will focus on Fr. Henri Nouwen's book, *The Return of the Prodigal Son - A Story of Homecoming.* Fr. Nouwen's insightful reflections centre on the different characters of Rembrandt's famous painting, *The Return of the Prodigal Son*, while also paying close attention to the biblical parable from which Rembrandt drew his inspiration.
