#### **BLESSING OF CANDLES**

On Wednesday, February 2nd at the 8 am Mass on the feast of the Presentation of Our Lord, we will bless candles during the Mass.

#### **BLESSING OF THROATS**

For centuries it has been a tradition for Catholics to have their throats blessed on or about the Feast of St. Blaise, the patron saint against throat ailments. The Blessing of Throats will take place at St. Patrick's Parish during the **5 pm Mass on Thursday, February 3**.

#### WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

The Sacrament of the Sick will be offered to parishioners on **Friday**, **February 11 at the 8 am Mass**. Those suffering chronic illness or pain are welcome to receive this anointing.

#### THE SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING

The Anointing of the Sick is that sacrament by which sick persons, through anointing with oil and the prayer of the priest, receive grace for the salvation of their souls and possible bodily healing.

Anointing is important because it strengthens our souls and bodies at the approach of death, either to heal us or to help us to die in a state of grace.. This is a crucial help because the condition of our souls at death completes our earthly pilgrimage and fixes our state for eternity.

The effects of Anointing:

- 1. Strengthening the Soul: Anointing strengthens the soul of the sick person by awakening confidence in God's mercy. It also gives the strength to bear suffering and resist temptation. Someone who offers their suffering to God in union with Christ can aid their own salvation and assist that of others. When the Eucharist accompanies Anointing in preparation for death, it is call viaticum, 'food for the journey.'
- 2. The Remission of Sins: Anointing takes away venial sins and, when the person is incapable of confessing, it can take away mortal sins as well.
- **3.** The Healing of the Body: The sacrament does heal our bodies when this is to our spiritual advantage.

#### **PERMANENT DIACONATE**

At the present time there are 43 deacons serving in the Diocese of Hamilton, and seven men are currently in formation.

Essentially a ministry of service and charity, the deacon serves the Church and the diocese in a designated service in a hospital, or prison, or other forms of charitable outreach. In addition, the deacon is assigned to a parish, as his

liturgical base, where he assists the pastor, as needed, in liturgical ministry which may take the form of assisting at Mass, preaching, baptizing, presiding at weddings or funerals, or in other capacities within the parish.

Deacons may be married, and spouses of deacons are invited and strongly encouraged to be involved in the vocation and ministry of their deacon-husband. Diaconate formation lasts for four years. ## WHAT DOES GOD PROHIBIT BY HIS COMMAND, "YOU SHALL NOT HAVE OTHER GODS BEFORE ME?"

This commandment forbids (c.f. Exodus 20:2):

- Polytheism and idolatry, which divinizes creatures, power, money or even demons.
- Superstition which is a departure from the worship due to the true God and which also expresses itself in various forms of divinization, magic, sorcery and spiritism.
- Irreligion which is evidenced: in tempting God by word or deed; in sacrilege, which profanes sacred persons or sacred things, above all the Eucharist; and in simony, which involves the buying or selling of spiritual things.
- Atheism which rejects the existence of God, founded often on a false conception of human autonomy.
- Agnosticism which affirms that nothing can be known about God, and involves indifferentism and practical atheism. Adapted from Comp. of CCC #445
