## EMERGENCY BAPTISM

“When an ordinary minister is absent or impeded, a catechist or another person designated for this function by the local ordinary, or in a case of necessity, any person with the right intention, is able to confer baptism licitly. Pastors of souls, especially the pastor of a parish, are to be concerned that the Christian faithful are taught the correct way to baptize” (CCC 903, 1284; c.f. Can. 861 §2).

If a person who is not baptized is in danger of dying, you may lawfully administer the Sacrament of Baptism. It is not necessary that the person who administers the sacrament be baptized themselves, as long as the sacrament is administered with proper intentions and not against the dying person’s will. In order for the baptism to be licit:

- ◆ You must have the intention of performing a valid baptism.
- ◆ Matter must be involved. The matter in the Sacrament of Baptism is water.
- ◆ You must use the proper “form” or *words of baptism* found in Matthew 28: 19 which invokes each person of the Trinity in his proper identity and eternal relationship to the other persons.

While pouring water (or even a small drop of water) over the person’s head, you say, **“I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.”**

The Roman Missal allows for the use of either the Apostles’ Creed or the Nicene Creed at Mass. It recommends that Lent and Easter, with their baptismal focus, are especially

appropriate times for using the Apostles’ Creed. **Now that the seasons of Lent and Easter have come to completion we will again be professing the Nicene Creed at Mass.** The Nicene Creed is a summary of the principle truths of our God as given to us by the early Church and has been passed on to every generation. As we profess and reaffirm the common faith that is the foundation of Christianity, we continue to share in those same truths professed by the early Christians.

## INTERESTED IN BECOMING A CATHOLIC?

Adults who have never been baptized and adults who would like to complete their Christian Initiation by receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation and/or First Holy Communion are invited to contact the parish office. Preparation sessions for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) will begin in the Fall. Those who are prepared will be baptized or will complete their Christian Initiation at the Easter Vigil, **Saturday, April 8, 2023.**

Those who have been baptized in another Christian tradition and who wish to enter into the full communion of the Catholic Church will be received individually, according to the preparation that may be needed. Children in grade 3 or higher who have never been baptized or, having been baptized elsewhere, now wish to become Catholics, should also begin a period of instruction and preparation.
