

THE OUTPOURING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT



In the Eucharistic Prayer, while giving thanks to the Father, the Church "implores the power of the Holy Spirit that the gifts offered by human hands be consecrated, that is, become Christ's Body and Blood" (*GIRM*, 79). The Church also prays that, by the action of the Holy Spirit, "the spotless Victim to be received in Communion be for the salvation of those who will partake of it" (*GIRM*, 79).

At the Annunciation (cf. Luke 1:35) the Holy Spirit overshadowed the Virgin Mary, forming the Body of Christ in her womb. At Pentecost (cf. Acts 2:4) the Holy Spirit was present in a mighty wind and tongues of fire to form the Body of Christ, the Church. In every Mass the Holy Spirit makes fruitful the Church's obedience to the command of Christ: "Do this in memory of me" (Luke 22:19). (Source: the Archdiocese of Philadelphia)



THE SOLEMNITY OF STS. PETER & PAUL

Veneration of the two great Apostles, Peter and Paul, has its roots in the very foundations of the Church. This year the solemnity was celebrated on June 29. Sts. Peter and Paul are at the origin of the Church's faith and will forever remain her protectors and her guides. To them, Rome owes her true

greatness, for it was under God's providential guidance that they were led to make the capital of the Empire, sanctified by their martyrdom, the centre of the Christian world, from which would radiate the preaching of the Gospel.

St. Peter suffered martyrdom under Nero in A.D. 66 or 67. He was buried on the hill of the Vatican where recent excavations have revealed his tomb on the very site of the basilica of St. Peter's. St. Paul was beheaded in the Via Ostia on the spot where now stands the basilica bearing his name. Down the centuries, Christian people in their thousands have gone on pilgrimage to the tombs of these Apostles. In the second and third centuries the Roman Church already stood pre-eminent by reason of her apostolicity, the infallible truth of her teaching and her two great figures, Sts. Peter and Paul.

In a sermon in the year 395, St. Augustine of Hippo said of Sts. Peter and Paul: "Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood. Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labours, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith."
