## THE WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY JANUARY 18 - 25



The theme for this year's week of prayer for christian unity comes from the book of Isaiah: "Do good; seek justice."

"When you come to appear before me, who asked this from your hand? Trample my courts no more; bringing offerings is futile; incense is an abomination to me. New moon

and sabbath and calling of convocation — I cannot endure solemn assemblies with iniquity. Your new moons and your appointed festivals my soul hates; they have become a burden to me, I am weary of bearing them. When you stretch out your hands, I will hide my eyes from you; even though you make many prayers, I will not listen; your hands are full of blood. Wash yourselves; make yourselves clean; remove the evil of your doings from before my eyes; cease to do evil, learn to do good; seek justice, rescue the oppressed, defend the orphan, plead for the widow. Come now, let us argue it out, says the Lord: though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be like snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall become like wool" (Isaiah I: 12 - 18).

Isaiah challenged God's people in his day to learn to do good together; to seek justice together, to rescue the oppressed together, to defend the orphan and plead for the widow together. The prophet's challenge applies equally to us today. How can we live our unity as Christians so as to confront the evils and injustices of our time? How can we engage in dialogue, increase awareness, understanding and insight about one another's lived experiences? These prayers and encounters of the heart have the power to transform us - individually and collectively. Let us be open to God's presence in all our encounters with each other as we seek to be transformed, to dismantle the systems of oppression, and to heal the sins of racism. Together, let us engage in the struggle for justice in our society. We all belong to Christ. ## THE CATECHISM IN A YEAR HOSTED BY ASCENSION PRESENTS

In 1986, St. John Paul II appointed then-Cardinal Ratzinger to lead the development of the new *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. It was a monumental task.

He also wrote: "Some people tell me that Catechism doesn't interest today's youth; but I don't believe this statement and I'm sure I'm right. A crime novel is compelling because it involves us in other people's fates, but which could also be ours; this book is compelling because it tells us about our own destiny and therefore concerns each of us closely. For this I invite you: study the catechism! This is my heartfelt wish."
