#### MARRIAGE

Jesus made marriage a sacrament. The Church knows that this means that he [Jesus] himself will provide the strength to keep the commitment. The hardness of our hearts (*left unhealed*) makes marriage extremely difficult, and perhaps even impossible, but grace softens hearts and works the

necessary miracle. A graced marriage opens hearts to a love and joy and peace of which we are not capable on our own. The unmarried can know a divine love and peace and joy, but the miracle of marriage



is that it enables a love neither *merely* divine nor *merely* human. It enables a love inextricably bound to one unique, unrepeatable human person in Christ - a love that enshrines the infinite, so to speak, not only in the Other but in the other, a love that is paradoxically unlimited precisely because it is circumscribed. *Source: http://www.catholic.com/magazine/articles/a-meditation-on-a-mature-marriage* 

## **CONVALIDATION**

Church law requires baptized Roman Catholics to marry before a bishop, priest, or deacon and two witnesses. Catholics who have married outside of the Catholic Church are encouraged to have their civil marriage recognized by the Church. This is called *convalidation*. The process does not cost anything, is often not very difficult and always helps the couple live their faith more fully. ## **SACRED PLACES**

"The worship in Spirit and in truth' (c.f. John 4:24) of the New Covenant is not tied exclusively to any one place. The whole earth is sacred and entrusted to the children of men" (CCC 1179), and all men are sacred and entrusted to God.

This does not exclude setting apart sacred physical places, however. A church building is "a house of prayer in which the Eucharist is celebrated and reserved, where the faithful assemble, and where is worshipped the presence of the Son of God, our Saviour...This house ought to be in good taste and a worthy place for prayer and sacred ceremonial...this house of God...should show Christ. That is the fundamental criterion for Catholic liturgical art and architecture.

It is natural for Catholic churches to be more ornate and magnificent than Protestant churches. A Protestant church building exists primarily for man to pray and worship in, but a Catholic church exists primarily to house and glorify God in the Eucharist (Source: Peter Kreeft's, Catholic Christianity).
