**PREFERENTIAL OPTION FOR THE POOR AND VULNERABLE**

"The measure of the greatness of a society is found in the way it treats those most in need, those who have nothing apart from their poverty" (*Tweeted July 25, 2013 by Pope Francis*).

The Preferential Option, or love of the poor and vulnerable, is a perspective on the world that maintains that we can measure the quality of justice in any society by the way its most poor and vulnerable are treated. The primary purpose of this special commitment to the poor is to enable them to become active participants in the life of society. It is to enable all persons to share in and contribute to the common good. The "option for the poor," therefore, is not an adversarial slogan that pits one group or class against another. Rather it states that the deprivation and powerlessness of the poor wounds the whole community. The extent of their suffering is a measure of how far we are from being a true community of persons. These wounds will be healed only by greater solidarity with the poor and among the poor themselves (*USCCB, Economic Justice for All, # 88*).

This Catholic social teaching calls us to discern, listen, see and respond to the cry of the poor through our words and actions. By doing so, we are not making a gift of what is ours to the poor, but we are giving back what is rightfully theirs (CCC 2446).
