THE PRESENTATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The feast of the presentation of Mary, celebrated on **November 21**, dates back to the 6th century in the East and the 15th century in the West. It is based on an ancient tradition that says Mary was taken to the temple in Jerusalem when she was 3-years-old and dedicated to God. What we celebrate on this day is the fact that God chose to dwell in Mary in a very special way. In response, Mary placed her whole self at the service of God. Every moment since your Baptism, God invites you to be open to his grace and dedicate yourself to him, as Mary did.

THE CENTRAL MYSTERY OF THE CHRISTIAN FAITH

The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes the Trinity as the "central" mystery of faith. It states, "The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the "hierarchy of the truths of faith" [GCD 43]. The whole history of salvation is identical with the history of the way and the means by which the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, reveals himself to men "and reconciles and unites with himself those who turn away from sin" [GCD 47]" (CCC 234).

DEVOTION TO MARY

The Church's devotion to the Blessed Virgin is intrinsic to Christian worship and so the Church rightly honours the Blessed Virgin with special devotion. By pronouncing her "fiat" at the Annunciation and giving her consent to the Incarnation, Mary was already collaborating with the whole work her Son was to accomplish.

From the most ancient times the Blessed Virgin has been honoured

with the title of "Mother of God" (*Theotokos*) to whose protection the faithful fly in all their dangers and needs...This very special devotion...differs essentially from the adoration which is given to the incarnate Word and equally to the Father and the Holy Spirit and greatly fosters this adoration. We revere all saints with *dulia* (human reverence and devotion) and Mary with *hyperdulia* (the greatest human reverence and devotion), but *latria* (worship and adoration) are given to God alone. (*c.f.* Lumen Gentium 66; CCC 971 - 973, 2083 -2084; Peter Kreeft's, *Catholic Christianity*; *Summa Theologiae* II-II, q. 103, a. 4; III, q. 25, a. 5).
