

#### OUR BOOK OF LIFE

Beginning **November I**, All Saints' Day, and continuing throughout the month of November, our Book of Life will be placed near the baptismal font. The Easter candle, representing the new and eternal life we have in Christ, will burn beside it. Parishioners are invited to write the names of deceased family and friends in our Book of Life so that they may be remembered, as a group, at each mass

offered in our parish throughout the month of November. Names entered in past years need not be rewritten each year as they are never erased and all names entered are perpetually remembered at the altar.

#### WHAT IS THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST?

The Liturgy of the Eucharist is the second and most significant part of the Mass. Christ Himself instituted it at the Last Supper so He could be continuously present in His Church until the end of time. The Liturgy of the Eucharist includes the preparation of gifts, where the bread and wine with water are brought to the altar; the Eucharistic prayer giving thanks to God for the whole work of salvation and the consecration whereby the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ; and the breaking of the one bread in preparation for the faithful receiving the Lord's Body and Blood, just as the apostles received it at the Last Supper from Jesus' own hands.
