

SCRIPTURE AT THE HEART OF THE SYNODAL JOURNEY

From the beginning scripture, both Old and New Testaments, have been at the centre of the Church's life. Through the quiet and subtle action of the Holy Spirit, the words

of scripture become living words in the Church. They renew and inspire and lift our hearts and imaginations to see God's redeeming and healing love at work in our lives, our Church and our world. The word of God is truly our 'food for the journey' so that no matter how difficult or tiring we may feel it to be, the weary soul is refreshed, and the sorrowful soul is comforted (Jer 31:25). As we read it and pray it, we encounter Christ in our midst and see ourselves, our Church, and our world through the eyes of faith. Like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, we can experience our hearts burning within us through life of the Holy Spirit and we know that He is with us always 'until the very end of the age' (Matt 28:20). Please join Fr. Joe and Peter Hoan in the parish hall on alternating Thursday evenings at 7 pm and Thursday mornings at 10 am for what will be called "Bible Sharing" that is encouraged by the Synodality process of the Universal Church.
