

### **WORLD DAY OF PEACE**

The following is the partial text of the Holy Father Francis' Message for the 58th World Day of Peace, to be celebrated on January 1, 2025 on the theme: "Forgive us our trespasses: grant us your

**peace."** In its statement, the Dicastery says the theme is inspired by Pope Francis's encyclical letters *Laudato* sí and *Fratelli tutti*, "and above all by the concepts of Hope and Forgiveness, which are at the heart of the Jubilee, a time for conversion that calls us not to condemn, but instead to bring about reconciliation and peace".

The Dicastery goes on to note by "considering the reality of conflicts and social sins afflicting humanity today in light of the hope inherent in the Jubilee tradition of the forgiveness of sins and the cancellation of debts, together with the reflections of the Fathers of the Church in this regard, concrete principles emerge that can lead to a much needed spiritual, social, economic, ecological and cultural change". ### **CHALKING THE DOOR AT EPIPHANY**

This liturgical year we are inviting parishioners to chalk their doors at Epiphany. Blessed chalk will be made available on the weekend of **January 4 & 5, 2025**. The blessed chalk is to be used to inscribe a simple formula on the lintel of your door. The formula includes the numerals for the year in question and the letters C + M + B. You then say a simple prayer asking God to bless your home. The formula looks like this:



So what do the letters "C, M and B" stand for? Most people will tell you that they stand for the names of the three wise men — Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar — and that is certainly a venerable tradition — but the letters also stand for the Latin phrase **Christus mansionem benedicat** which means "May Christ Bless this House."

Chosen by Vatican Official and film expert, Msgr Dario Viganò, for the Dicastery of Evangelization's "Jubilee is Culture" initiative is: Anthony Hopkins movie "One Life". In this movie London broker Nicholas "Nicky" Winton helps rescue hundreds of predominantly Jewish children from Czechoslovakia in a race against
