

WINTER LEARNING SERIES

In 2025 the universal Church will celebrate a Jubilee Year - a year of renewal in faith. The theme of the year established by Pope Francis is "**Pilgrims of Hope**". Pope Francis has asked that the preparation for the Jubilee be marked

in a particular way by rediscovering the teachings of Vatican II, in particular the four Constitutions, and by prayer. WORLD DAY OF PRAYER 2025

Based on Psalm 139: I - 18, the 2025 World Day of Prayer program invites the participants into the knowledge that every human person was made with care and love by God. When this profound truth is

received, everything in our lives changes and we begin to radiate and shine from within. We also learn how to treat every other person as made wonderful by God.

The first Guiding Principle in the World Day of Prayer articulates that the starting point is Christian women. This has been an essential conviction of the movement over the last century. Too often, women and girls have been silenced and oppressed. The message that we, as women and girls, are "fearfully and wonderfully" made in the image of God reinforces the movement's support of women in expressing their faith and speaking about their lives in prayer and worship before God and in community.

The day of prayer will focus on adoration and thanksgiving to God our Creator, followed by prayers of confession and longing. Finally, the prayers of intercession will guide us to ask God for wisdom, courage and healing, that our world would come to treat all people as "fearfully and wonderfully made."

REJOICE & BE GLAD

Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation, "Rejoice and Be Glad", is both challenging and encouraging. If you're married, you can be holy by caring for your spouse (the way Christ cares for the Church). If you're employed, by working with integrity you can practice holiness. Treating your neighbors with kindness is another way you can be faithful to the person God created you to be and live a holy life

Francis goes on to say, "At its core, holiness is experiencing, in union with Christ, the mysteries of his life. It consists in uniting ourselves to the Lord's death and resurrection in a unique and personal way, constantly dying and rising anew with him." Every experience of our lives can be a step along our path to growth in holiness. A good read.
