FASTING DURING LENT

Fasting, which can have various motivations, takes on a profoundly religious significance for the Christian: by rendering our table poorer, we learn to overcome selfishness in order to live in the logic of gift and love; by bearing some form of deprivation — and not

just what is in excess — we learn to look away from our "ego", to discover Someone close to us and to recognize God in the face of so many brothers and sisters. For Christians, fasting, far from being depressing, opens us ever more to God and to the needs of others, thus allowing the love of God to become also the love of our neighbour (cf. Mk 12: 31; Benedict XVI).

Through prayer, music and scripture, the Way of the Cross allows us to join Our Lord on His journey to Calvary - each Friday evening during Lent at 7 pm in the Church followed by Mass.
