

THE RIGHT TO LIFE AND THE DIGNITY OF THE HUMAN PERSON

Abortion and euthanasia have become preeminent threats to human dignity because they directly attack life itself, the most fundamental human good and the condition for all others. They are committed against

those who are weakest and most defenseless, those who are genuinely "the poorest of the poor." They are endorsed increasingly without the veil of euphemism, as supporters of abortion and euthanasia freely concede these are killing even as they promote them. Sadly, they are practiced in those communities which ordinarily provide a safe haven for the weak -- the family and the healing professions. Such direct attacks on human life, once crimes, are today legitimized by governments sworn to protect the weak and marginalized. CREATE IN ME A CLEAN HEART

The ninth commandment forbids an act of the heart (coveting another's spouse). The "heart" is the scriptural term for the very center of the soul,

as the physical heart is the center and source of lifeblood in the body. The heart is deeper than feelings, emotions or sentiments. It is also deeper than thought, for it is the source of thoughts as it is the source of feelings. Solomon advises, "Keep your heart with all vigilance; for from it flow the springs of life" (Prov 4:23). "The heart is the seat of moral personality: 'Out of the heart come evil thoughts, murder, adultery, fornication' [Mt 15:19]"; as well as good thoughts, charity, purity and honour. "The struggle against carnal covetousness entails purifying the heart" (CCC 2517). We must begin farther back than with actions; we must "make every thought captive to obey Christ" (2 Cor 10:5). RESURRECTION IS MORE THAN IMMORTALITY

The significance of Christ's Resurrection was not merely that it was visible proof of life after death. The soul was always immortal, a fact always knowable by human reason. But Christ's Resurrection brought a new reality into the universe: a new kind of body, a human body that was as immortal as the soul. The immortality of the soul is not an idea that is unique to Christianity. Most religions teach it. But the resurrection of the body, foretold by the Jewish prophets, came true only in Christ.

Christ's Resurrection bestows new dignity on our bodies by revealing to us a new, unexpected, and glorious eternal dignity for them. C.S. Lewis says, "These small and perishable bodies we now have were given to us as ponies are given to schoolboys. We must learn to manage: not that we may some day be free of horses altogether, but that some day we may ride bare-back, confident and rejoicing, those greater mounts, those winged, shining and world-shaking horses which perhaps even now expect us with impatience, pawing and snorting in the King's stables" (Miracles).
