#### THE NATIVITY OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The Church has celebrated Mary's birth since at least the sixth century. Scripture does not give an account of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary which the Church celebrates on September 8. However, the apocryphal *Protoevangelium of James* fills in the gap. According to this account, Anna and Joachim are infertile but pray for a child. They receive the promise of a child who will advance God's plan of salvation for the world. Saint Augustine connects Mary's birth with Jesus' saving work. He tells the earth to rejoice and shine forth in the light of her birth. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley. Through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed." The opening prayer at Mass speaks of the birth of Mary's Son as the dawn of our salvation, and asks for an increase of peace. # WHAT IS FORBIDDEN BY THE FIFTH COMMANDMENT?

The fifth commandment forbids as gravely contrary to the moral law.

- direct and intentional murder and cooperation in it;
- direct abortion, will as an end or as means, as well as cooperation in it. Attached to this sin is the penalty of excommunication because, from the moment of his or her conception, the human being must be absolutely respected and protected in his integrity;
- direct euthanasia which consists in putting an end to the life of the handicapped, the sick, or those near death by an act or by the omission of a required action;
- suicide and voluntary cooperation in it, insofar as it is a
  grave offence against the just love of God, or self and of
  neighbour. One's responsibility may be aggravated by the
  scandal given; one who is psychologically disturbed or is
  experiencing grave fear may have diminished
