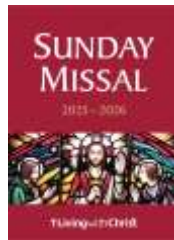

Pope Leo XIV at General Audience: The Resurrection Transforms Every Aspect of Our Lives



When Christ rose from the dead, He did not return to His disciples surrounded by angels, performing spectacular deeds or giving great speeches to reveal the secrets of the universe, Pope Leo reminded the faithful at his Wednesday General Audience. Instead, His Resurrection was marked by the humility of simple, ordinary gestures, appearing as a gardener, a foreigner, or a passing stranger. Where we, and the disciples,

might expect "special effects, powerful signs, or overwhelming proof," Jesus prefers the language "of closeness, of normality, of a shared table." This "surprising aspect" of the Resurrection, the Pope said, contains a "precious message for us: The Resurrection is not a dramatic plot twist, but a silent transformation that fills every human action with meaning," showing us that "in the Paschal Mystery of Christ, everything - even the most ordinary human gestures - can become grace."
