THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

Today is the Church celebrates the Epiphany of the Lord. The word *Epiphany* is from a Greek word meaning “appearance or manifestation.” After

being made known to the shepherds of Bethlehem, Christ is revealed to the Magi who have come from the East to adore Him. A popular axiom says, “Wise men (*and women*) still seek him.” Today, we no longer need to travel far to find Jesus, for Christ is always present in his Church, especially in her liturgical celebrations. He is present in the Sacrifice of the Mass, not only in the person of his minister, but especially in the Eucharistic species. By his power he is present in the sacraments so that when anybody baptizes, it is really Christ himself who baptizes. He is present in his word since it is he himself who speaks when the holy Scriptures are read in the Church. Lastly, he is present when the Church prays and sings, for he has promised ‘where two or three are gathered together in my name there am I in the midst of them’ (c.f. CCC 1088).

ST. PATRICK PARISH FIRE EVACUATION PLAN

Upon Discovery of Fire:

1. Calmly notify all occupants in the immediate area of the fire condition.
2. Leave the building immediately by the nearest and safest exit.
3. Close all doors behind you.
4. Sound the alarm by activating the manual pull station.
5. Call the fire department from a safe location 911.
6. Say there is a fire at: St. Patrick Church, 53 Wellington Street, Cambridge

Upon Hearing the Fire Alarm:

1. Leave the building immediately by the nearest and safest exit.
2. Close all doors behind you.
3. Call the fire department from a safe location 911.
4. Say there is a fire at: St. Patrick Church, 53 Wellington Street, Cambridge

Evacuation Meeting Place:

Proceed to the parking lot at the North side of the property away from the church and driveway to allow room for emergency vehicles. This is the designated meeting place for all staff and visitors in the event of an emergency situation.
